

○ **Common career paths after graduating from junior high school**

After graduating from junior high school in Japan, students have to option to look for employment or proceed to further their education. Their career paths are shown in the following figure.




- After graduating from junior high school, students often have to take academic achievement tests to seek employment or enter higher education.
- Students and parents work together with the schools to address the issue of employment and the furthering of the student's education. Documents necessary for employment or higher education may be submitted to the employer or higher education institution via the junior high school. Please consult your school about future career paths as soon as possible.

As shown below, information on career paths after graduating from junior high school is provided in various ways.




(2) Opportunities for career path counseling.

○ **Public High School Examination Procedures and Details (for students entering in 2023)**

The following is the application procedure for those who wish to enter a public high school (full-time, evening, or flex course) after graduating from junior high school.




[Exam topics]

- Academic achievement tests
- Self-expression
- Independent school entrance exams
Some schools may conduct independent school entrance exams that include interviews, essay and short thesis writing, and practical skill tests.

[Determining successful applicants]

- The school will determine successful applicants based on a comprehensive evaluation of the academic achievement tests, questionnaire, and the self-expression interviews (in addition to the independent school entrance exam).

- Self-expression

- The questionnaire and self-expression interview (in addition to the independent school entrance exams) will be used to determine the successful applicants.

- **Selection for international students, etc.**

<Full-day course>

The "Special Admission Selection for Returnees and International Students" is held on the same day as the preliminary selections.

[Quota]

Up to 2 students from each high school

[Exam topics]

- Academic achievement tests for 3 subjects (Japanese, Math, English)
- Essay, Interview
- Self-expression
- (○ Independent school entrance exams)

[Eligible applicants]

Those who meet all of the following criteria are eligible to take the exam.

- Individuals who possess foreign citizenship
- Japanese junior high school graduates or those scheduled to graduate from junior high school in March.
- Generally, people who have been in Japan for 6 years or less after entering Japan

<Evening and Flex courses>

The following is the application procedure for the primary selection.

[Exam topics]

- Academic achievement tests for 3 subjects (Japanese, Math, English)
- Essay, Interview
- Self-expression
- (○ Independent school entrance exams)

[Eligible applicants]

Those who meet all of the following criteria are eligible to take the exam.

- Individuals who possess foreign citizenship
- Japanese junior high school graduates or those scheduled to graduate from junior high school in March.
- Generally, people who have been in Japan for 6 years or less after entering Japan

※1 The questions are the same with the preliminary selection. The exam papers will contain kanji letters with enlarged ruby characters (reading guides). We will conduct interviews and essay writing exams instead of testing for social studies and science.

※2 The questions for Japanese, mathematics, and English are created at each respective school. A general achievement test in social studies and science may be conducted depending on the school.

※ Many high schools hold open campus events during the summer and fall to offer more information about high schools. Dates for events such as open campuses will be posted on the respective school websites.

① High School Scholarship [For public high schools, etc.]

Tuition fees will be virtually free.

(Eligible applicants)

- Students whose parents' income is below the threshold income.
- A family of four with an annual income of less than ¥9.1 million.

(Amount)

¥118,800 per year [for full-time course high school students]

② High school student benefits [national, public schools, etc.]

Financial aid to cover textbooks and costs other than tuition fees. (repayment not required)

(Eligible applicants)

- Households living on welfare or residence tax exempt households (with other requirements)

(Amount)

¥32,300 to ¥143,700 per year [per eligible high school student, etc.]

③ High School Learning Environment Enrichment Scholarships [National, Public, and Private High Schools, etc.]

We will provide financial assistance in purchasing computers for the student. (no repayment required)

(Eligible applicants)

- Households living on welfare or residence tax exempt households (with other requirements)

(Amount)

Up to ¥35,000 per year [for those enrolled in the public high school full-time course]

④ High school scholarships and admission reserve funds [national, public, and private schools, etc.]

Partial loans are provided for 3rd year junior high students and high school students (must be repaid).

(Eligible applicants)

- Students whose parents' income is below the threshold income. (with other requirements)
- A family of four with an annual income of less than ¥9.1 million.

(Amount)

[Admission reserve fund] ¥50,000, ¥100,000 yen, ¥150,000 ※The admission reserve fund is applicable only for 3rd year junior high school students.

[Scholarship] ¥18,000 to ¥35,000 per month

Enrolled April 2021; Full-time course, general studies

1	- I attend a high school with a picturesque campus. My sister also graduated from high school in Japan and found a job at a company of her choice. After hearing stories about Japanese high schools from my sister, I decided to apply to my current school.

1	- I chose this school because a relative of mine who graduated from this school recommended it to me.

Enrolled April 2021; Evening course, general studies; 2 years enrolled

1	- I chose to enroll in this school because I wanted to concentrate on improving my Japanese skills. Another reason is so that I could have a chance to engage in club activities and other things that I liked doing.
2	- You can learn things such as how to play badminton during club activities. - I can wear what I want to school because there are no designated uniforms.
3	- Class hours are between 2:55 p.m. and 9:15 p.m., so you don't have to wake up so early in the morning. - International students who aren't very fluent in Japanese can join classes (1 subject of Japanese from this year) according to their proficiency level.

2	- The teachers and students at High School are amiable and willing to talk and answer questions. The lessons are easy to follow, and the explanations are clear and easy to understand. - I can train and practice a lot at the badminton club, which is a lot of fun.

Enrolled April 2021; Evening course, general studies; 2 years enrolled
