- (1) Youth under 18 years old (preferably high school students)
- (2) Have not previously participated in this forum
- (3) Be highly interested in realizing international peace (the abolition of nuclear weapons)
- (4) Actively participate in English discussions
- (5) Join in group activities according to the program
- (6) Must attend the entire program unless there are unavoidable circumstances
- (7) Be highly motivated to make use of the experiences of this program to participate in international exchanges and local activities
- (8) If there is no accompanying chaperone, the participant is able to travel alone from a local domestic airport to an airport in Japan

12. How to apply:

- (2) You can download the application form from the Hiroshima Prefectural Government's website.

13. Selection process:

(1) Selection of participants:

After an examination of the application documents, participants will be chosen. The results of the selection will be sent to all applicants.

(2) Revocation of participant status:

Even after being selected, if a chosen participant at any time performs an action unbecoming of a participant or if a serious health issue arises, his/her status as a participant may be revoked.
