Program Details for international students enrolled at a university in Hiroshima

1. Program Objective:

Invite foreign high school students, Japanese high school students and international students enrolled at a university in Hiroshima to think about international peace, share ideas, deepen mutual understanding, and spread a message of peace around the world in order to bring about a “world without nuclear weapons”.

2. Role of international students

- Convey the attractiveness of Hiroshima (incl. study environment) to high school participants from overseas toward promoting study abroad to universities within Hiroshima Prefecture.
- Perform the role of facilitator and timekeeper during the discussions.
- Disseminate information through SNS in the same manner as the high school students.

3. **Sponsor:** Hiroshima Prefectural Government

4. **Dates:** August 20 (Tue) to 23 (Fri), 2019

5. **Location:** International Conference Center Hiroshima
(1-5 Nakajima-cho, Naka-ku, Hiroshima City, Hiroshima Pref.)

6. **Theme:** What can we do to bring about international peace?
(Initiatives toward the abolition of nuclear weapons, reconstruction and peacebuilding)

8. **Participation fee:** Free

9. Costs covered by sponsor:

- Transit from home to venue
- Lodging in Hiroshima City: 3 nights (August 20-22) **Only for members requiring accommodation*
- The following costs will be covered during the program:
Meetings, documents, tours (admission fees, charter bus costs, etc.), Welcome reception, Meals during the program

**The cost of various fees will be calculated by the Hiroshima Prefectural Government.*

- International students enrolled at a university* in Hiroshima: 15 people

11. Application period:

Applications must be received by Friday, July 12, 2019.

12. Requirements for application:

(1) International students enrolled at a university* in Hiroshima

**"University" includes: universities, junior colleges, technical colleges, Japanese language schools, and vocational schools*

- (2) Talk about the attractiveness and study environment of Hiroshima to high school participants from overseas.
- (3) Be highly interested in realizing international peace (the abolition of nuclear weapons)
- (4) Actively participate in English discussions as a facilitator / timer
- (5) Join in group activities according to the program
- (6) Must attend the entire program, unless there are unavoidable circumstances.
- (7) Be highly motivated to make use of the experiences of this program to participate in international exchanges and local activities

13. How to apply:

- (1) The application form must be submitted to the address below (in 15) by post or e-mail.
- (2) You can download the application form from the Hiroshima Prefectural Government's website.
** The office will carefully manage any personal information submitted, and will use such information only within the objectives of this program.*

14. Selection process:

- (1) Selection of participants:
After an examination of the application documents, participants will be chosen. One participant from each country/region will be selected. The results of the selection will be sent to all applicants.
- (2) Revocation of participant status:
Even after being selected, if a chosen participant at any time performs an action unbecoming of a participant or if a serious health issue arises, his/her status as a participant may be revoked.
